Course Overview

This course explores the relationship of law, government and ethics to business enterprise. Provides overview of legal and ethical issues relevant to business decision-making and planning and the government regulations of business.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, successful learners will be able to:

- ▶ Discuss the application of law in today's world
- ▶ Identify the structure of the American legal system and how that system functions in civil, criminal, and appellate legal processes
- ▶ List basic terms of the U.S. Constitution and how it affects and limits the law-making power at both the state and federal levels
- ▶ Identify key stages in civil litigation
- ▶ Distinguish between the legal and ethical issues presented in various business situations

- ▶ Identify the principle of jurisdiction in respect to the American legal system
- ▶ Identify alternatives to litigation that may be used for dispute resolution and explain the advantages and disadvantages of each relative to those of litigation
- ▶ Explain various principles of substantive law that impact on business decision-making with an emphasis on tort, product liability, contract, real, intellectual, and personal property, agency, and employment law
- ▶ Compare and contrast the major types of business organizations, and explain the methods of creation, powers, rights and duties of each type
